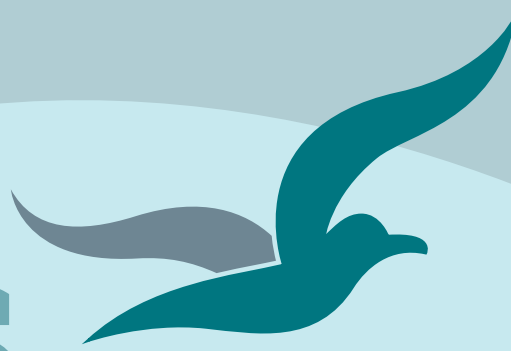

Focused on building a safe off-road pathway between Ruakākā Towncentre and Marsden Cove Marina

A Bream Bay Shared Path Committee has been formed with 14 members to work towards the establishment of safe off-road pathways for cyclists and pedestrians in the Ruakākā /One Tree Point area. The group is seeking registration as an incorporated society.

It's initial focus will be to build a pathway between the Marsden Cove Marina to the Ruakākā Towncentre. The proposed route is over an easement between Marsden Maritime Holdings and the Hermpac warehouse then across the McEwan Rd bridge and down the berm on the northern side Marsden Point Rd to Ruakākā Township.

Members of the group have already been working towards this end gathering 195 signatures on a petition and letters of support from: Bream Bay College, the Northern Trucking Alliance, the Marsden Lions Club, Marsden Maritime holdings and Bream Bay retirement village to present to the Whangārei District Council along with a request for funding in the Council's 2024 - 2034 Long Term Plan. Sixty-three of the signatures on the petition were from log truck drivers with 80% of them reporting near misses with pedestrians

NRC decision on Meridian solar farm expected in August

Construction of Meridian's Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) at Marsden Point is well underway. The foundation pads for the batteries are nearly finished and the containers housing the batteries are now being transported to the site from Whangārei and being installed. Meridian expects all 80 battery containers will be installed by late June. The next stage is the electrical and mechanical fit out, with the BESS on track for completion in December 2024.

Construction Manager Alan de Lima said with the development of electricity generation from renewable

EDITORIAL

Fifty years ago in the files of the Bream Bay News

I have boxes of old issues of the Bream Bay News in my office, carefully filed away by former owners. These can make interesting reading. It is surprising how, while newspaper production has moved on from closely typed pages printed out on cyclostyle machines at Ruakākā Primary or Bream Bay College, the types of stories covered have not.

The June 1974 issue ran a report from the Ruakākā Residents and Ratepayers Association

Most residents will be aware that an objection was lodged to the proposal to dispose of treated effluent into the Ruakaka River at an emergency,

As the cost of our objection exceeded funds of the Association our solicitors agreed to reduce the costs and the remaining amount was met by Committee Members of the Association. We therefore appeal to members to pay outstanding subs to help the situation – 50c p.a.

Can someone tell me if the Ruakākā Residents and Ratepayers Association appeal was upheld?

Now there are plans to dispose of treated wastewater through an outflow pipe into Bream Bay. The Whangārei District Council gained consents for this some years ago. At the time the need for the outflow seemed a long way off. I recall it was estimated that in 30 years time that this could be needed and there was a proviso along with the consent that all means of land based wastewater disposal should be considered first.

However, the rapid residential development in Ruakākā and One Tree Point. has brought that date closer. The Council's draft Long Term Plan 2024 to 2034 proposed to spend \$60 million on an upgrade of the Ruakākā Wastewater Treatment Plant and the construction of the outflow pipe after some other options are investigated.

I think the critical aspect of this will be to make sure the wastewater is treated to a very high standard before it is discharged.

I had an interesting conversation recently with someone who worked on the treatment plant for water taken from the Waikato River for Auckland's household water supply. He told me it would have been easier to treat water from the Mangere Wastewater Treatment Plant to the necessary safe drinking standard than it is to clean water from the Waikato which is akin to an open sewer with all kinds of discharges into it. However it would have been nigh impossible to convince the people of Auckland that drinking treated wastewater was a good idea..

I am finding those old files fascinating reading and am considering running a regular column with excerpts from the Bream Bay News of 50 years ago. I am also prompted to tidy up the current Bream Bay News files so that in years hence someone can look through them and find all over again, that things haven't really changed all that much. I wonder if the new wastewater treatment and disposal system will be built within the next 50 years.

Urinary Tract Infection

A Urinary Tract Infection (UTIs) is a reasonably harmless, though painful, condition that many people are too embarrassed to get help for. In some cases ignoring the pain and discomfort can lead to serious complications so it's important to get it checked out.



The urinary tract consists of the kidneys, the ureter (which

connect the kidneys to the bladder), the bladder and the urethra. A UTI is caused when this area becomes over populated with bacteria.

Although most common in women, because they have shorter urethras than men, it is still possible (although rare) for men and children to get a UTI. Symptoms are often specific to either the upper or lower areas of the urinary tract. An upper UTI can often be an indicator of more serious complications such as kidney infection and should be seen by a doctor. Any child with a suspected UTI should be seen by a doctor promptly.

Symptoms of a lower UTI include:

- pain and a burning sensation when you are passing urine
- the urgency and frequency of urinating
- feeling like your bladder is full and you can't empty it
- pain in the lower abdomen
- funny smelling urine.

Symptoms of an upper UTI:

- fever and chills
- nausea and vomiting
- blood in the urine
- pain in the lower abdomen and back.

Pregnancy can often make you more susceptible to a UTI because of hormonal and physical changes, while diabetics are also vulnerable due to higher sugar levels in their blood. Other factors that increase the likelihood of UTIs are being sexually active, changes in the immune system and structural abnormalities in your body.

Treatment

There are a variety of ways to treat an UTI. In some cases they are resolved by themselves, your pharmacist can provide you with products to relieve the symptoms such as urinary alkalisers and in some cases supply antibiotics without seeing your doctor or determine whether you need to see your doctor. Antibiotics treat the infection and kill the bacteria while urinary alkalisers help to ease symptoms and provide relief from burning sensations.

Prevention

Preventing UTIs is easier than you think. There are some simple steps you can take, such as:

- drinking plenty of water
- wiping from front to back after using the toilet to avoid transferring bacteria from the anal area
- not using vaginal sprays or douches
- urinating after sex to flush away any bacteria
- not holding it in if you need to use the toilet.

In addition, there is some evidence that cranberry products can help prevent UTIs as they prevent bacteria from sticking to the lining of the bladder.

Northland is currently been found to have the fastest growing population in New Zealand. It also has the room to grow to match this - economically!! But we need a motorway alongside a railway that equally feeds both the west and east coast.

Unfortunately the Brynderwyns slip is a spanner in the works! But is it?

Alternative routes must now be made.

The east coast is too fragile. Not so long ago houses were evacuated because the hill was moving downwards into the sea going into Langs beach. I wonder how long the pohutukawa trees will stay growing with the extra pounding taking part on their roots right now. They could already be dying....

The cost for businesses using the Paparoa and Dargaville bypass is crippling.

Northland needs a bypass for all.

Waipu Gorge Road tarsealed and made into a two lane highway could be the answer.

It is already configured to carry logging trucks with big double lane bridges and metalling to carry the heavy loads. This road could prove to be an asset for Northland.

The mooted bypass routes using Brooks, Finlayson, Millbrook or Helmsdale Roads will cut through productive farmland, making these routes more expensive.

Waipu Gorge Road could be money well spent for Northland as a bypass around the Brynderwyns.

and cyclists on the Port Marsden Highway.

Stage 2 of the project would take the trail through an existing under road tunnelling adjacent to Bream Bay Village on One Tree Point Rd. and across land opposite the Ruakākā Towncentre where Meridian Energy plans to build a solar panel farm.

Keith Newey said he supported the project for two reasons – he hoped in the future to get time to ride a bicycle and he was well aware of how dangerous the mix of cyclists and big trucks on the same roads could be.

Grant Brown, the new group's secretary, said both Councillors Phil Halse and Ken Couper had supported the proposal and had been helpful in identifying council easements over which the trail could be built.

He said this project will be one of the most exciting to happen for Marsden Cove, One Tree Point and Ruakākā for many years and could only promote people to live in the area and business to grow.

Jules Flight was elected as Chairman of the new committee, Stephen Gibson as deputy Chairman, Grant Brown as secretary and Des Meiklenjohn as treasurer. The Waipu National Bank turns 100

A celebration of the 100th anniversary of the National Bank building at the corner of Nova Scotia Rd. and Cove Rd was held in Waipu on Saturday 1 June. The National Bank first started operating in Waipu in 1920. Originally it was an agency which operated out of the Paparoa Branch. Its staff provided teller and customer service functions but for more involved services, e.g. loans etc. people need to travel to the Branch. 1

Later it was operated from the Maungaturoto Branch due to the closer proximity. A Mr Lindsay used to come to Waipu twice a week via the Waipu Gorge Road with a box of money and revolver on the seat beside him.

In 1924, a single-storey wooden building was built on the corner of Nova Scotia Drive and Cove Roads. Mr Lindsay continued to operate the Agency until it became a Branch in its own right in August 1936.

Mr. Peat, who was a manager at Morrinsville, transferred to Waipu and an attached manager's residence was built in 1937. Although the building was wired for electricity, initially the premises were lit by kerosene lamps and heated by open fires until the electricity supply was connected in 1938.

On the September 6, 1984, the building was listed with

Heritage NZ as a Category 2, Historic Landmark.

In March 1998, it reverted back to an Agency of the Whangarei Branch and was closed the following year on 28 May 1999. This was a disappointing day for Waipu as the Post Office had closed 10 years earlier.

Since then, the building has been used as a Medical Centre and for a short while, after fire devastated two businesses in The Centre, the Waipu Pharmacy operated from the building. It is now in private ownership and has been restored and is used for retail and office space. Sandra McKay's first job when she left school in the early 1980s was at Waipu's National Bank. She remembers on her first day being shown the safe and a gun should she need to use it. She recalls the gun was quite big and kept in a leather case. She never had to use it.

Sandra said at that time there were around ten people employed at the bank including the bank manager who lived on the premises.

Local business people would come in to deposit their takings and working people would bring in their pay cheques to cash.

Sandra worked at the Waipu bank for around a year before being transferred to another branch.

Bream Bay Classic reaches capacity with 100 players in just one week

The Waipu Golf Club's most prestigious annual event, the Bream Bay Classic, reached its full capacity of 100 entries just one week after the club sent out posters announcing the dates to golf clubs around the northern North Island.

Club Captain John Pennington attributes the rapid sell-out to several factors. "Many players are returning to chase the coveted trophy, with last year's winners, Sheldon Kearns (Open) and Brad Winger (Masters), returning to defend their titles. The recent upgrade of the Waipu Golf Course has also contributed significantly to the quick sell-out. The course is in excellent condition and a joy to play on," he said.

This year, 13 men and 2 women from the Waipu club will be competing. Overall, the event will feature 42 competitors in the Masters division, 6 in Woman's division, and 52 players in the Open division.

The event has been renamed the Signature Homes Bream Bay Classic, with the Northland branch of this building company taking over sponsorship from previous sponsor Northpine.

The 2024 Signature Homes Bream Bay Classic will take place on July 6 and 7.

The competition is divided into three categories:

- Women's Division: Played over 36 holes with a maximum handicap of 9

Decision on Meridian solar farm expected in August

sources Battery Energy Storage plays an increasingly important role in electricity supply, able to store energy when the wind isn't blowing or the sun isn't shining.

The Ruakākā BESS will store up to 100MW of electricity – enough to power around 60,000 households for up to two hours in winter.

Meridian is also in the consenting process for a solar farm made up of approximately 250,000 solar panels;

Mr. de Lima said, the solar farm will produce roughly 120MW of electricity, enough to provide a significant and reliable power supply for Northland, and to reduce the reliance on electricity generated from other parts of the country.

Meridian lodged resource consent applications for the solar farm in September 2023. In February 2024, we obtained resource consents from the Whāngārei District Council, which covered the construction and operation of the solar farm and related effects (which includes traffic, stormwater, contaminated land, noise, landscape and visual effects).

Resource consent applications were also lodged with Northland Regional Council in September 2023 for earthworks, associated stormwater diversion and discharges, and vegetation clearance across the three solar farm sites. A decision from the NRC is expected in August.

Marsden Point rail spur estimated at close to \$1 billion

Kiwirail is working on ways to reduce the cost of the Marsden Point Rail Spur, which was estimated at being close to \$1 billion.

Jane Sheriff – Community engagement Manager for Kiwirail, said in a press release last week, “We expect to complete the detailed design and value engineering work and present it, along with a revised cost estimate and business case to the Government by mid-2025. It will allow a more certain understanding of the actual costs and present choices which can be used to inform the Government’s consideration around funding to build the Marsden Point Rail Link and complete the Kauri – Otiria upgrade.

Although piles of new concrete sleepers are stacked all along the line, Kiwirail announced last week that the upgrade of the Kauri to Otiria upgrade is on hold “so it can be aligned to the Marsden Point rail link”.

The Ministry of Transport’s 2019 Northland Rail Business Case found that upgrades to the existing rail line, which KiwiRail has already completed, as well as reopening the line to Otiria and building the Marsden Point Rail Link could see rail volumes increase from about 110,000 tonnes of freight a year normally to around 2.2 million tonnes.

Ms. Sheriff said, “About 80 percent of freight into and out of Northland goes by road so, if these collective rail projects all go ahead, they will help lighten that load, reduce carbon emissions and deliver a more balanced and resilient transport system for Northland.”

Revised version of t Vaco Investments Waipu Gateway application due to be lodged in August

If the new application looks substantially different from the original one why is there not a new application with the process starting again?”

New hearing dates of Monday 14 October and Tuesday 15 October 2024 have been set for the application by Vaco Investments (Waipu Project) Ltd. for its planned development of a service station and commercial centre at 47 Millbrook Road, Waipu.

A revised version of the Vaco Investments application must be lodged no later than 4pm on Friday 9 August and this will be made available on the Council’s website from this date. The Whangarei District Council’s revised hearing report shall be made available no later then 4pm on Wednesday 18 September 2024. The applicant’s expert evidence shall be lodged with the WDC no later than 4pm on Wednesday 25 September 2024 and any submitters expert evidence needs to be lodged no later that Wednesday 2 October.

Opening legal submissions need to be lodged no later that 4pm on Wednesday 9 October.

The Whangārei District Council received 52 submissions on the original proposal

for a BP petrol station, a fast food and other food outlets with additional space for light industrial and commercial activities.

Forty three of these were in opposition and nine in support to the Waipu Gateway Service Centre when submissions closed on 5 February.

One objection came from the New Zealand Transport Agency which raised concerns about the proximity of the entrance to the proposed development and the Braigh /State Highway One intersection and stormwater from the development entering the highway roadside swale.

Other objections were from residents of Waipu who had concerns about the effects of such a development on the town.

Objector Richard Cole says if the new application looks substantially different from the original one submitters will need more time to respond.

He asks “Why is there not a new application with the process starting again?”

Let's finish the Waipu to Waipu Cove Cycle and Walkway

Committee members of the Waipu to Waipu Cove Cycle and Walkway group have been on a fundraising drive to finish the trail and since April the Waipu community has donated an additional \$67,000. They would like to acknowledge donations from the Alec McLean Trust and Waipu Cove Reserve Board as well as the many donations from locals. The Committee will be acknowledging all those who have contributed \$1,000 or more with signage on the track when it is completed.

After a pause while easements were worked out and a wait for contractors to be available, a lot of progress has now been made since April, with another 800metres formed along Cove Rd. from the McLean Road corner.

With the additional donations to date, there are now enough funds in hand to continue on and build another 500 metres of trail. However, another \$40,000 is needed to take the trail to Johnson Point Rd., which the committee hopes to achieve over the next few weeks.

To get the last stage built from Johnson Pt. Rd. to Hamon Rd. another \$60,000 will be needed, so at this point another \$100,000 is required to take the trail to where the Whangārei District Council has said it will take over to build the trail around the Riverview Place corner. The committee will continue to raise funds to make this a reality with applications to funding organizations and seeking the help of the community. Steel pan chamber music success for Bream Bay College students

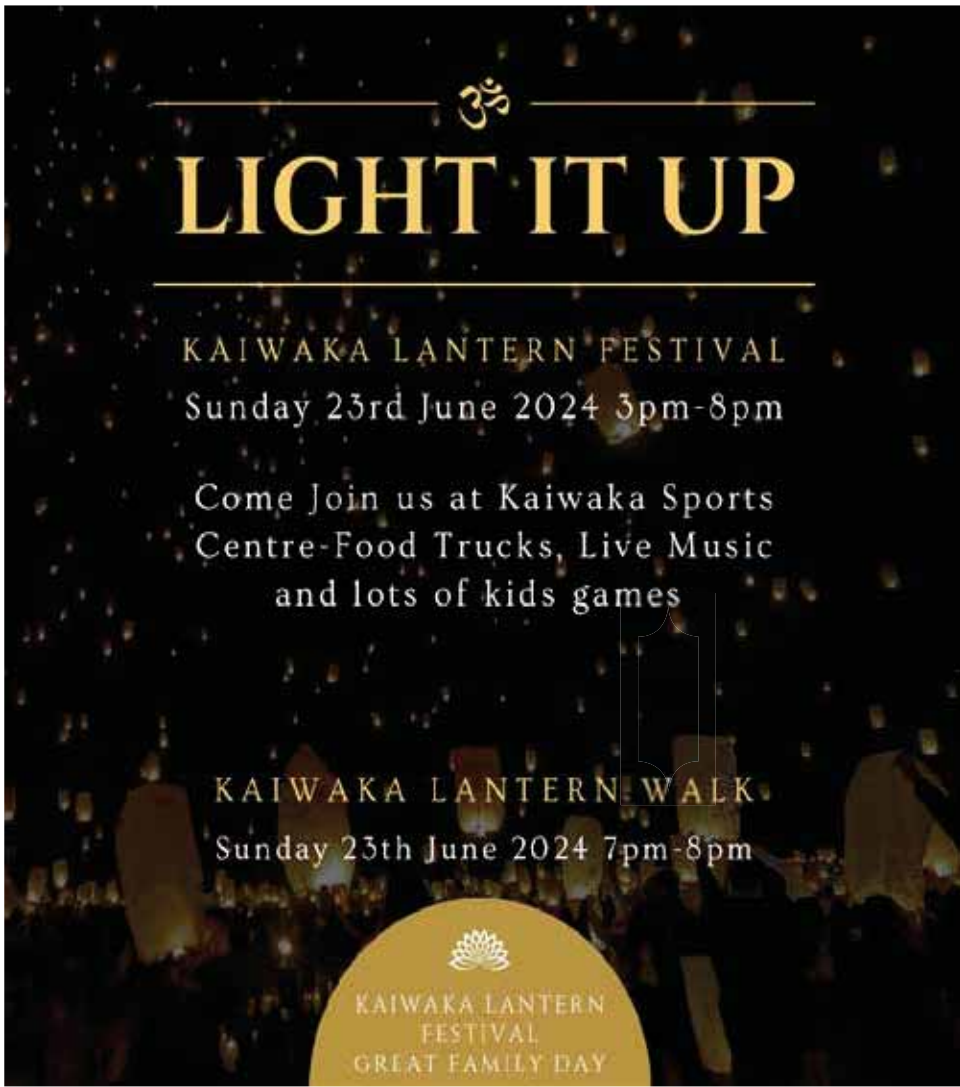

Ruakākā Library raises \$15,000 to support children's literacy

Since 2013 the Ruakākā Community Library has initiated and run the Ruakaka Citizen of the Year award but in 2023 it was decided we should focus our efforts into the overwhelming need to promote literacy in our community.

One Tree Point School Principal, Shirley Winters spoke at one of our meetings of the need to purchase sets of books and train teaching staff to teach *Structured Literacy* and it was decided the library would fundraise to support this cause. As a result, One Tree Point School, Ruakākā School, Waipu School and Bream Bay College have had the benefit of money raised in our local community by our Library volunteers.

Structured Literacy has proven to be a successful method of teaching literacy to all age groups and has particularly good outcomes for children struggling with other methods of learning literacy. Government funding has historically been inadequate to fund the specialised resources and training required. Schools across New Zealand have persisted with the Structured Literacy teaching approach to literacy and are now being recognised with promises of Government funding.

Over the last 16 months the Ruakākā Community Library has raised \$14,650 to purchase specialized sets of readers. This sum has been divided equally between the four schools.

The library committee would like to thank all its sponsors and Library volunteers who have made this possible. These include: Meridian Energy, Ruakākā Community Library, Ruakākā Residents and Ratepayers, Waipu Lions, Orrs Pharmacy, Point Timber, Christina Maassen, Beryl Williams, Francie Stokes of Bream Bay Realty Thanks also to the Ruakākā Recreation Centre, which made space available for initial planning meetings.

Many patrons made individual contributions into a collection jar at the library and our Easter Raffle was well supported with ticket sales.

Moving into the future the Ruakākā Community Library will join forces with the Bream Bay Learning Community to continue to bring the love and inspiration of books to our children and to support literacy alongside our local schools.

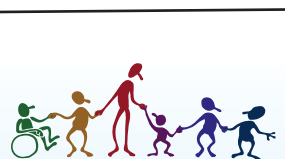
