Vehicles ban at the Waipu Estuary

Vehicles are no longer permitted to drive within two kilometers of the northern side of the Waipu Estuary. The newly adopted Northland Regional Plan has established vehicle exclusion zones to protect wildlife and shore ecosystems in Northland. Along the shores of Bream Bay there are three such zones: at Langs Beach, on both sides of the Ruakākā Estuary: i.e: in the Ruakākā Wildlife Refuge and the beach either side of the Waipu Estuary, extending from Waipu Cove to a point two kilomentres north of the river mouth.

The Ruakākā Refuge and Langs Beach were already vehicle free zones under a Whangārei District Council Vehicles on Beaches bylaw but now have an extra layer of protection. However, the rule for vehicles driving to the northern edge of the Waipu Estuary has been a bit less clear.

The Waipu Wildlife Refuge already had an overlay of protection under the Wildlife Act 1953 but, despite what would seem to be some obvious breaches, it has been difficult to establish the high level of evidence of disturbance needed to take a prosecution under this act. Consequently the Waipu Wildlife Refuge has been a battleground over recent summers with beach drivers arguing and sometimes threatening conservationists trying to protect shorebird-nesting sites there.

The vehicle exclusion zones came about after a number of appeals to the Environment Court made after the release of the NRC's proposed Regional Plan in 2017. In June 2023 the Environment Court released its final decision directing the NRC to implement vehicle exclusion zones on beaches around Northland as it found the impact of vehicles in these areas is "a risk to significant ecological sites and threatened species". EDITORIAL

See you at the Waipu Parade

It's nearly the end of the year but with so much happening it doesn't feel like there is any winding down. There is the Brynderwyn closure and search for the best bypass option, the Kāinga Ora plan to build 50 new homes in the Ruakākā Village, the adoption of the NRC Regional Plan, which finally places a ban on vehicles driving in and near the Waipu Wildlife Refuge and that's just in Bream Bay. With the coalition's government's headlong rush to repeal everything the previous Labour government enacted there is a lot happening on a national level as well.

I am very concerned about the new Minister of Transport, Simeon Brown's statement that cycling and walking initiatives are "a waste of time" and his directive to the NZ Transport Agency to push the pause button on all cycle and walkway initiatives across the country. There are two cycle/walkway projects under way in Bream Bay. The Waipu to Waipu Cove trail is two thirds complete and, after ten years plus of hard out fundraising, planning and negotiation easements by the Waipu to Waipu Cove Cycle and Walkway Trust this really needs to be finished. In its present state, with cyclists and walkers having to compete with traffic on the middle section of the trail it is dangerous. I am particularly worried about this situation when Cove Rd becomes State Highway One when the highway over the Brynderwyns will close for two months for repairs early in the New Year.

There is also strong support for a shared path between Marsden Cove and the Ruakākā Towncentre and a group has formed to get this project underway. Without any central government funding on offer I hope we can find the resources within our communities to complete these two projects.

Something to celebrate though is a \$25,000 grant from Foundation North to the Bream Bay Coastal Care Trust to get a weed control programme underway on the conservation land along the Bream Bay shore. I am dreaming of the day when the whole coastline can be planted in beautiful native trees rather than all that gorse, tobacco weed, wild ginger, Sydney golden wattle and every other weed known in Northland that grow there at present. Pohutukawa all around Bream Bay are looking glorious at present. How about a big pohutukawa planting bee on the Matariki public holiday next July? I haven't heard yet that the Matariki celebration is on the list of things to be repealed by our new government.

At the Waipu Christmas Parade on Christmas Eve I will give a big sigh of relief and look ahead to a short break before the New Year when it all begins again.

I am so pleased that the Promote Waipu group has managed to twist a few arms and to keep this Christmas Eve tradition. After being told that there were no traffic managers available to work on Sunday evening they found some.

There is always such a wonderful atmosphere at the Waipu parade. People all over Bream Bay take part. or come along to watch. All the university students return to be with their families. Grandchildren have arrived. The holiday homeowners have turned up and everyone is happy.

Strong demand for proposed new Kāinga Ora homes from local people

Many of the people who attended the Kāinga Ora drop-in sessions at the Bream Bay Community Trust over the past two Thursday mornings (7 & 14 December 2023) were interested in finding out how they could apply for a home with the NZ Housing agency.

Käinga Ora Regional Director for Northland, Jeff Murray, said hearing about the reality of those without a suitable place to call home is always tough.


"We heard about overcrowding and accommodation intended for one person that was now home to many. Unaffordable rent and a shortage of homes were commonly referenced issues, and the desire to stay in Ruakākā because of whanau, friends, work, and school took priority over nearly everything else," he said.

At the drop-in mornings Kāinga Ora staff discussed the proposal for 50 new state homes on Tiki Place and Tamingi Street in Ruakākā. Sixteen old homes would be removed from the site and relocated.

Käinga Ora also has six standalone homes currently under construction at the racecourse end of Peter Snell Road. These will likely be

used for some of the $K\bar{a}$ inga Ora tenants whose current homes would be demolished.

Mr. Murray said, no relocations will take place for at least six months and customers required to relocate would be given the choice to return to one of the new homes on completion should they wish.

He said, "We are committed to keeping in regular contact with the Ruakākā community as our plans progress and would like to thank everyone for the constructive conversations had to date."

Kāinga Ora plans to lodge resource consent with the Whangārei District Council in early 2024.

Mr. Murray said, the proposal is currently in the early stages and no decisions have been finalised.

The final community drop-in session for 2023 is planned for 9am this Thursday 21 December, at the Bream Bay Trust building, 9 Takutai Place, Ruakākā.

We have advised the minister of the concerns our tourism industry and businesses have, and we have provided him with the detail that its costs over \$2m to Northland's economy for every day this highway is closed

Increased costs on just about everything, especially construction and roading, has necessitated councillors working extended hours to go through the many scenarios in developing our Council's Long-Term (10 year) Plan. This is due out for consultation in March.

Our biggest debate is do we pay as we go or load the plan with increased debt and place the future generation in a very difficult position?

Vehicle ban at Waipu Estuary

The ban came into force on Tuesday 12 December 2023 when Councillors voted to adopt the regional plan. The plan, with the addition of the beach exclusion zones, had earlier been signed off by the then Minister of Conservation, Willow-Jean Prime in October.

Under the new regional plan vehicles also cannot drive on pipi, tuatua, toheroa or cockle beds, over shorebird nesting sites or areas of indigenous vegetation such as saltmarsh or mangrove aerial roots. Anyone breaking these rules is subject to a fine of \$500.

While the NRC exclusion zones extend only up to the mean high water mark, at the Waipu estuary the beach area above this point and the dunes behind are a Department of Conservation reserve where, under The Northland Reserves Bylaws 2007 Section 13(1) it is illegal to operate any vehicle with a fine of up to \$5000 applying. Although the various laws and bylaws applying to the beach north of the Waipu estuary are complex, the situation has now been simplified – no vehicles are permitted on the beach (or in the dunes) two kilometres north of the river mouth. (To be clear vehicles are not permitted in dunes inside Conservation Reserve areas along the length of Bream Bay).

Exceptions to the vehicle ban in the exclusion zones include: Council and Department of Conservation activities, environmental monitoring, kaitiaki monitoring, access to customary marine title, rescue of stranded marine mammals, burial of deal animals, removal or recovery of wrecked vessels, coastal restoration, access for people with mobility disabilities and surf lifesaving operations

NRC General Manager of Regulatory Services Colin Dall said, "Bream Bay is one of the first areas we'll be focusing on for publicity and education on the vehicle exclusion areas."

He said NRC staff are currently working with other agencies to make sure there's a coordinated approach.

He aims to have signage in place early in the New Year.

If you see a vehicle inside one of the exclusion zones you can phone the NRC Incident Hotline on 0800 504 639. You will need a date, time and location, the make, model and registration of the vehicle and if possible a photograph showing the vehicle and distinctive landmarks.

Because the initial focus is education, the first action will likely be getting in touch with the vehicle owner and explaining what the new rules are and where they apply. The full Northland Regional Plan is available to view on the NRC website at: www.nrc.govt.nz/newregionalplan.

Sand ladder installed at Mair Rd.

The Department of Conservation has installed the much awaited sand ladder to replace the beach access steps that were smashed in Cyclone Gabrielle in February 2023 has been installed at the end of Mair Rd. just in time for Christmas.

The ladder is to the right of the car park as you face seaward, up a short track to a spot where the sand cliff is a bit less steep. It consists of a line of half round posts bolted onto two lengths of heavy duty chain stretched down the sand cliff to the beach.

Abigail Monteith, of the Department of Conservation said, the ladder "should provide a weather-proof option for access moving forward.

She said a planned sand ladder to replace the smashed Te Kamo St access steps is not needed at this stage as there is comfortable access to the beach.

However DOC "will monitor this entrance and if things change will relook at installing the ladder."

Police Report

Not just the bad stuff

Sergeant Mathew Nicolson, the Officer in Charge at the Bream Bay Station, has been busy introducing himself to local people. On Sunday morning after delivering the Police Report to the Bream Bay News he was heading to the Ruakākā Surf Lifesaving Club to meet club members and discuss any issues.

He said Police work is not all about "the bad stuff" and that sometimes Police can support community initiatives for positive change

Lots of reports of dangerous driving

The station has been receiving a lot of calls from people concerned about erratic and dangerous driving. One such tip off led to a 20-year-old Whangārei man being stopped by Police on State Highway One at Ruakākā last week. He was breath tested and found to have a breath alcohol level of 732 micrograms of alcohol per litre of breath. The legal limit for drivers over the age of 20 is 250 micrograms. He was also found to be driving whilst disqualified. His car was impounded and he will be appearing in the Whangārei District Court on 10 January.

Crash on Brynderwyns closes south bound lane

At around 3.30pm on Friday 15 December a south-bound driver crashed into the bank on the Brynderwyn Hill near the waterfall. The southbound lane of State Highway One was blocked for around an hour and the woman driver was taken to Whangārei Hospital by ambulance with suspected broken ribs.

Strong wind tips trailer

During high winds on Tuesday 12 December, a trailer flipped over on State Highway One at Ruakākā at around 1pm. The incident did not cause too much disruption on the highway as the trailer ended up in the roadside ditch and the Ute towing it was undamaged.

Crash following a medical event

On 14 December there was a single car crash at Paparoa after the driver suffered a medical event. The car went off the road and crashed into a ditch. The man was taken to hospital by ambulance



After 18 years with the Ruakākā Fire **Brigade Fire Chief Darrell Trigg has stepped** aside to allow others to step up

Darrell Trigg stepped down Ruakākā's Fire Chief after serving 18 and half years with the Ruakākā Brigade and, prior to that, 17 years with Kamo.

He was born into the job. His father Bruce was a professional fire fighter in Whangārei and for the first five years of Darrell's life he lived behind the fire station.

Darrell said, "I grew up surrounded by the brigade and brigade

life. I had my own short length of hose, which I ran out, coiled up and ran out all day long. I was hooked."

Firefighting runs in the family. Darrell's father went on to become Kamo's Fire Chief and, as a young man, Darrell joined this brigade. His brother Steve also has a long and distinguished career in the fire service and is currently Fire and Emergency Community Risk Manager in the Nelson/Malborough region.

Darrell said his dad, who died in 2013, taught him about leadership telling him. "No matter what, your people come first."

When he is asked to recount his most memorable call out over those 35 plus years, Darrell tells of when as a young recruit he attended a fire at the Kamo New World supermarket. The blaze began after some young people thought they would have some fun setting a bin full of cardboard alight at the back of the building. When the brigade arrived the supermarket was well ablaze. Darrell entered the storeroom in full fire fighting gear with Ray Davidson, another Kamo Brigade member who was also a professional fire officer for the Marsden Point Oil Refinery. Darrell's job was to carry the hose while Mr. Davidson directed the water.

Darrell said, "I heard a thud and turned to see Ray lying on the floor. There were boxes piled high in the storeroom and all the water we were spraying around had softened the cardboard. Some cans



of baked beans had fallen and hit Ray's helmet, knocking him unconscious."

Darrell dragged the unconscious man out of the burning building. He was taken to hospital where he spent the night in intensive care but was discharged the next day with no serious long-term

Darrell said, "Unfortunately that time we didn't save the building. The supermarket was demolished to be replaced by a Four Square store. Darrell pays tribute to his wife Marlene who has supported him in all the years he has been involved in the brigade. He joined up in June 1988 and met Marlene in August 1988.

"For the entire 35 years we have been in it together, it's been a hell of a ride that we would not change a minute of. She is an amazing person that always puts the interests of others ahead of herself and works tirelessly to support the brigade and brigade life. There is absolutely no way I could have achieved anywhere near what I have, without her total and unwavering support."

Darrell is the managing director, founder and owner of Trigg Construction, one of Northland's leading commercial building companies, which he and Marlene founded in. He is also a director of the Master Builders Association. How has he managed the role of Ruakākā Fire Chief alongside all this?

He says the trick is not to micro- manage.

"I came to understand that my main task as Fire Chief was just to create an environment people wanted to be in. If I was going to micro manage its not going to work. When people join the brigade they want to do something. If you don't let them do their jobs they don't stay around. I support them 100% and if they have a problem I can be there but for the most part I just stood out of the way and watched them flourish."

He encourages members of the brigade to get" outside this station and the red trucks to really experience what being a firefighter really means. Waterway competitions, conferences, stair climbs, even courses all allow you to make new life-long friends as I have. These experiences are where you really learn and improve yourself and bring new knowledge back to the brigade and community."

He said being a fire fighter connects you to a worldwide community. On a recent trip to Italy he met up with a fire fighter from New York and they had a great chat together.

The work of the Ruakākā Fire Brigade has doubled in the 18 years he has been a member. In 2005 there were 81 call outs. By Thursday 14 December 2023 with two and a half weeks of the year still to go there had been 165 call outs. These are fires, vehicle accidents and "purple call outs": life threatening medical events such as chokings and heart attacks where they assist St John. But Darrell sees his stepping down as another means of letting the Ruakākā Brigade's men and women who he has helped train, get on with it.

"If I stayed around as a firefighter I would be like a ghost fire chief and its better if I just step aside. I am not going anywhere. I will still be here if I am needed"

He is gratified to see some of the young recruits both men and women stepping up in their roles and taking responsibility.

"It makes me really proud. It's really cool and there is not a lot more that I can do."

No beach ambassador patrols this summer

There will be no Beach Ambassador Patrol this summer Constable Martin Geddes set up the patrol in 2015, following a spate of drownings along the eight-kilometre stretch of beach between the Ruakākā Surfclub and the Waipu Estuary. Three of the drownings were Asian men who had been attempting to retrieve crab pots. The Beach Ambassador patrollers drove the beach in a Gator utility vehicle and handed out leaflets written in English and Mandarin with water safety messages and advised those entering the water to wear lifejackets. Constable Geddes said it was getting harder to recruit

volunteers for the patrols, as most people prefer to be on holiday themselves over the Christmas season.

Also the number of sizeable paddle crabs in the sea has dropped off and there aren't the same numbers of people arriving to fish for them. However there were

lots of juvenile crabs so things might change over the next few years.

He invites local people interested in beach safety to get in touch and if there is enough interest he would look at reviving the patrol next summer.

Although there will be no summer patrol Constable Geddes and the Waipu Cove Surf Lifesaving Club participated in a drowning prevention seminar at Uretiti on Saturday 9 December.

An earlier beach seminar had been held in November. The seminars are organised by Drowning Prevention Auckland and constable Geddes said the day had been very successful. He believes the water safety message has spread and been widely adopted amongst the Auckland Chinese community





Menzshed membership grows as the search continues for somewhere to build a new base

The Waipu Menzshed celebrated a year's work at its Christmas party held on Tuesday morning12 January. On display were examples of wooden trellis, a chicken roosting box and the Menzshed speciality: lots and lots of rat and stoat trap boxes.

Representatives of the Bridge Forest Trust had turned up to collect there latest order a truck load of 90 boxes. They have purchased hundreds of these boxes from the Wainu Menzshed and said the quality was very high. They said boxes purchased from other suppliers often

have flaws that and need to be retro fitted.

The Bridge Forest Trust works on predator protection for three kiwi populations in Rodney. They supply traps to private landowners or maintain trap lines themselves over ab area of 50,000 hectares.

Piroa Brynderwyn Landcare also buys the predator trap boxes from the Menzshed. The Menzshed supplies kitset packs that tschool children can put together themselves. Other products are tank stands for kauri dieback spray stands, park benches were to large to carry around.

The Waipu Menzshed lease on the Masonic Lodge building expires in May and the group is looking to build a new base somewhere in central Waipu. They are hoping to get the go ahead to build on some Whangarei District Council owned land.

Chairman Gordon Walker said with their membership now at 60 it is getting difficult to fit everyone into the lodge anyway.

The Menzshed members meet every Tuesday morning to get to work on their various projects. There is also now a women's Menzshed group which meets on Fridays and contributes to the
