Twenty-nine properties needed for new airport at One Tree Point

The high price of real estate in One Tree Point might be the best protection people living there have against Whangarei's new airport being built in their midst, Councillor Ken Couper told those present at the Ruakaka Resident and Ratepayers Annual General meeting on Tuesday 10 May.

Councillor Shelley Deeming said at least 29 separate properties would need to be purchased in order to build the airport at that location and that the Council would have to pay market rates for each of these.

Fraser Campbell and Stacey Sharp consultants working for the Whangarei District Council on its public engagement process on the site of its proposed new airport came at short notice to speak at the meeting. A representative of the Power Company Meridian who was to speak on the proposed Marsden Point solar farm and electricity storage facility had to pull out at due to a Covid 19 infection.

Mr. Campbell told the meeting there are four sites being considered- one of these being the current airport location on the Onerahi Peninsula

He said this runway at 1100 metres in length is the shortest in New Zealand and it requires a dispensation from the Civil Aviation Authority to land aircraft there. Air New Zealand currently flies a Dash 8 to Whangarei which is an aircraft designed for short runways but this plane is becoming obsolete and the airline has

How to prepare for the flu season

With autumn upon us it means winter is fast approaching - shorter days, cold weather and unfortunately, the flu season.

The flu viruses that circulate can change from year to year.

The official flu season runs from May to September, and although anyone can get the flu, it doesn't mean you will definitely get it every year. People who are fit and well are better able to ward off the flu. If you eat a balanced diet,



exercise regularly and get enough sleep, your body will be in good shape to fight back against any invading flu virus.

So, how do you get the flu? The flu is a viral infection passed from person to person via infected droplets commonly spread by sneezing and coughing. Symptoms of flu include:

- a fever greater or equal to 38°C
- at least one respiratory symptom, like a cough, sore throat, or runny nose
- rapid onset with at least one systemic symptom, like a headache, aches and pains, sweats or chills, or fatigue.

Flu symptoms are severe and are not to be confused with cold symptoms - with the flu you often don't have the energy to get out of bed.

Some people are more at risk of getting the flu than others. The Ministry of Health has identified that the following groups are at higher risk of developing complications from flu viruses and are therefore eligible for a free flu vaccine. They include those who:

- are pregnant
- are significantly overweight
- use asthma preventers
- have diabetes
- are aged 65 years or over
- have heart disease
- have kidney problems
- have a serious medical condition, like cancer.

If you are unlucky enough to get the flu, you should stop the spread of flu germs by:

- staying in bed and not going to work or school
- covering your mouth when you cough and sneeze
- regularly washing your hands and drying them thoroughly
- avoid crowded settings.

This may all sound like doom and gloom, but flu prevention is better than cure. Help prevent flu by:

- washing your hands thoroughly and often and avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth
- eating a balanced diet with fruit and vegetables rich in vitamin C
- getting enough sleep
- reducing your stress levels
- getting regular exercise.

And remember that flu can cause serious complications, like pneumonia, which can be deadly. So look after your health – it is your most cherished possession.

Resident and Ratepayer Associations could use more members

I wish more people would join our local Resident and Ratepayer Associations

The Ruakākā Resident and Ratepayers Association is very active, preparing dozens of submissions to Councils and Government agencies each year on a wide range of subjects. Secretary Richard Morris puts out a monthly newsletter to all members. At its recent Annual General Meeting the association voted to half its annual subscription in the hope this will encourage more people to join.

President Jules Flight has said he would like to see more of the people who have moved into the new subdivisions join so the association can hear what their concerns are.

There is also a shortage of younger people at the meetings and women are in the minority. If there was stronger representation from the Ruakākā Village perhaps the association could be effective in solving some of the issues people there have such as dangerous driving on residential roads.

The Waipu Residents and Ratepayers Association could also do with more members. President Morris Somner invites everyone present to put forward their concerns in a round at the end of the monthly meeting so a range of issues can be aired and Secretary Glenice Lyon is good at keeping members in the loop with regular emails.

Waipu has an active business association – Promote Waipu, which lobbies very effectively for improvements in the town but the Resident and Ratepayer Association has a broader focus, looking after the interests of everyone who lives in Waipu and its surrounding countryside.

Note the inclusion of the word Residents in the titles of both these organizations. You don't need to own real estate to belong. In fact, it would make both associations more representative if they had people who are renting homes as members.

While a healthy rivalry exists between Ruakākā and Waipu, we do have many issues in common and I believe stronger links between our resident and ratepayer groups could be useful.

Local Government elections are coming up in October and attending resident and ratepayers meetings will help you to understand what is at stake. The Ruakākā association is already planning a *Meet the Candidates* evening.

The Whangārei District Council's Bream Bay Ward representatives Ken Couper and Shelley Deeming, as well as Rick Stolwerk, our Coastal South Representative on the Northland Regional Council attend both the RRRA and WRRA meetings, so these are good places to find out what our local body governments are up to and to hold our elected politicians to account. The monthly resident and ratepayer meetings are also useful for our Councillors to learn about local issues. This two way communication, when you come to think of it, is essential in a functioning democracy.

The Ruakākā Residents and Ratepayers Association meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 7pm in the upstairs lunge of the Ruakākā Recreation Centre. Annual subscriptions are \$10.

The Waipu Residents and Ratepayers Association meets on the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm in St Peters Anglican Church in Nova Scotia Drive. Annual subscriptions are \$5. Both associations welcome new members. See you there.

indicated it will be replaced in 2030 by planes which will need at least and 1500 metre long runways

As the Onerahi airport is located on a peninsula there is no room to extend the runway here and reclamation would be a very, very difficult exercise because of its inner harbour locations and the proximity of the Waikaraka Marine Reserve.

In addition to the One Tree Point site two others are being considererd at Ruatangata In 2020 the Council purchased properties here bounded by Three Mile Bush Road, Poroti and Kokopu Block and Peter Hope asked if this demonstrated a Council preference for this site but Councillor Shelley Deeming said at the time of the purchase the Council made it clear that this did not pre- empt a decision on the new airport's location.

People pointed out the One Tree Point site would impact the most people. Trevor le Clus commented that the proximity of an airport could devalue property and a lot of people had invested their life's savings into their homes in One Tree Point.

Mr. Campbell agreed although he said residents in Ruatangata were also concerned about the presence of an airport in their neighbourhood.

Mr. Campbell said all three of the possible new airport

sites had adequate clear flat space for a runway with clear airspace free of obstructions at either end. There was land alongside for the operational requirements of an airport and all are relatively close to state highways and to the Whangārei city centre.

In its favour the One Tree Point site had the best transport links but was slightly further away from the city centre than the other two sites

The Council has already purchased some land at Ruatangata and Peter Hope asked if this meant it had already for a preference for this site but SD said when the purchase was made it was stated that this in no way indicated a final choice had been made.

Eric Woodwood asked about the likelihood of the One Tree Point site being impacted by a tsunami. He said the evacuation undertaken when there was a tsumani warning in had been chaotic and all the extra people associatied with an airport would add to the confustion. Stacey Sharp replied that a study into coastal hazards would need to be done on the One Tree Point sitebefore a decision is made.

Mr. Campbell said it would be up to the new airport operator to organize its own tsunami evacuation plan.

Budget support for Northport floating dry dock

Funding to complete the feasibility study into the building of a shipyard and floating dry dock at Northport was announced in the 2022 budget from a \$199 million fund for "detailed planning activities."

The dry dock proposal was announced several years ago in Northport's *Vision for Growth*. Northport personal have been actively explaining the concept to representatives of the Bream Bay and wider Whangārei community.

The floating dry dock would be designed to service New Zealand Navy vessels, Cook Strait Ferries and New Zealand's domestic cargo fleet as well as visiting international vessels.

Northport has estimated this facility would create 400 permanent jobs for marine engineers, fabricators, electricians, painters etc.

Vessels are required to go into a dry dock every five years and with a limited number of these facilities around the world they are always in demand.

The proposed dry dock would be located on the western side of the port where it would have more shelter from weather and tidal flows.

Another budget announcement is a technical engineering feasibility study into establishing a new mega port at Manukau. It has been estimated that the Auckland Port will outgrow its location in the next 30 -50 years. A 2017 study conducted under the coalition agreement between Labour and New Zealand First had favoured a Northport expansion.

However, Jon Moore, CEO of Northport has said that he doesn't believe Ports of Auckland can shift to Northport.

"It wouldn't fit."

Rather he said Northport has an important role to play in supporting Auckland, particularly North Auckland and Northland

"We can do a lot to ease congestion in the other ports." Minister of Transport Michael Wood has said a decision on the location of a new port for Auckland will be made before the 2023 election.

Another Mayoral candidate from the south

We have another local candidate for the mayoralty of Whangārei District – well almost local. Mike Budd lives just over the hill in Mangawhai, which is not actually part of the Whangārei district. However Local Government election rules allow people who don't live in an area to stand in the local government elections there as long as two people who do live in the district nominate them.

While not actually living here Mr. Budd says Whangārei is where his heart is. He grew up in the city and attended Whangārei Boys High School.

He excelled at sport representing Northland in football, softball and rugby and he captained the NPC rugby team.

He completed a carpentry apprenticeship in Whangārei and then set up a building business here with a friend. He has been away from the district for the past 20 years.

He says he has spent 25 years working in "competitive organisations" and his "skillset, network and energy align to the needs of this role."

Most would-be mayors spend a term or two serving as councillors to learn the ropes before having a tilt at the top job but Mr. Budd said this lack of past involvement in Council means his thinking is "fresh".

He said in a presentation piece sent to the Bream Bay News,

"The district needs to provide facilities and activities for our youth and tamariki..."

"I want to inspire an era of identity and connectivity for all Whangārei people that embraces growth and development "I want to lead a team to create one of NZ's most desirable districts, for all ages, genders, religions and races.

The Bream Bay News asked Mr. Budd if he had any specific ideas on how to provide facilities and activities for youth and tamarik.

His reply: "I have dozens of ideas, and after conversations with people I believe

the idea's are already in the community wards and my job will be to find them through discussion and consultation. We will then prioritise and action with each of the local wards. Personally I'd like to see Laurie Hall carpark as a 6 story carpark with the top floor dedicated to a park and amenities. It would be safer than the current mixed use area. This could then be connected to the Quay by a walkway opening up to more activities that are planned for the Quayside town basin development"

Asked if he supports the Whangārei District Council's creation of a separate Māori ward he replied, "I support democracy and it's process. The local council has already positioned the Māori ward in place and I'm keen to work with Māori to support their needs. Me specifically; I want to help all kiwis based on their needs.

The Oruku Landing development is back on the table - Would he support a Whangarei District Council contribution to this project?

Mr. Budd said, "The key part of this project seems to be the conference centre. I do support the development but not a 27% rates increase. The maths doesn't seem to add up? I'm sure we can find a way with multiple funding streams."

Val Klink - the friendly face behind the reception desk at OTP Primary is retiring after 33 years

Val Klink, the friendly face at the reception desk at One Tree Point Primary. is leaving at the end of this term having worked at the school for a total of 33 years.

Principal Shirley Winters said, Val " literally knows everything about the school. We are going to really miss her warmth, good humour invaluable knowledge of her role and the school."

Val began working in Learning Support in 1983 when her daughter was just six years old. She had previously served on the Parent Teacher Association.



Val is leaving at the end of Term 2.

She took a break from the school in 1992 to work at the Penny Loaf Bakery in Ruakākā but returned in 1996 and has been there ever since. Six different principals have come and gone in that time. .

Sometimes a parent will come to enroll their child and be surprised to find Val who was at the reception desk when they went to primary school is still there.

"I say well I am allowed to be".

It's a busy place the reception area at One Tree Point school with parents, children and teaching staff coming in to pick up or drop of keys, sign in, sign out, admitting children to the sick bay and keeping an eye on them, welcoming visitors and giving them directions and numerous other activities going on around her. It must be hard to keep track of it all.

Val said the biggest requirements for the job are "patience, tolerance and you have to like children".

What has changed? Has the school grown in size? Well no. When Val first worked there the big expansion at the Marsden Point Refinery was underway and the roll was 300. It now sits at around 190.

An enrolment zone put in place by the Ministry of Education has changed the mix of children. OTP can no longer take children from Ruakākā Village.

"But children are lovely wherever they come from",

She regrets that high rentals are pushing some families out of the area.

Val plans to take things a bit easier in her retirement. She doesn't want to travel with Covid 19 still rampant around the world but she will be spending more time in her garden and looking around for a few exercise classes to join.


Wendy said she understands that there will likely be winter sports on, but as the event runs for three hours

Ruakākā Residents and Ratepayers Association subscriptions reduced from \$20 to \$10

"Yes, you heard correctly", said Jules Flight Chairman of the Ruakaka Resident and Ratepayers Association after the group's secretary Richard Morris proposed subscriptions be reduced from \$20 to \$10.

Mr. Morris said subscriptions made up a relatively small proportion of the association's income and he felt it was better to keep these as low as possible in the hope this would encourage people representing diverse sectors of the community to join.

Mr. Flight said in order to represent the Ruakākā and One Tree Point communities better, the association would benefit from having a wider membership. He is concerned that although there are a large number of people moving into the area these newcomers are not engaging with the association and it is difficult to

know what their issues might be.

He told the Bream Bay News, "In this area with such rapid residential and industrial development there are big impacts on the environment and on infrastructure and people living here need to engage."

In his annual report he gave a long list of submissions made by the group. 

The national transport agency Waka Kotahi is consulting on a proposed speed limit reduction on State Highway One alongside Ruakaka Primary School. The proposal is that the current limit of 100km/h be reduced to 80 km/h from 400m northwest of Sandford Road to 400 km/h southeast of Sandford Road and a variable speed limit of 80km/h and 60km/h apply directly outside the school, from 200m north of Sandford road to 200m south of Sandford Rd. The press release on this did not specify when the 60kmph limit would apply but presumably this would be before and after school. The Ruakākā School day begins at 8.40am and finishes at 2.30pm.

Feedback is invited on the proposal with a cut off date of 11pm on June 14 2022.

From the Waka Kotahi website: "Once consultation closes, we will consider all submissions and notify you of our final decisions. Implementation of the new speed limits is likely to take some time and will be rolled out in stages."

High performance sports psychologist shares some of his insights



Sports psychologist Campbell Thompson, guest speaker at a Bream Bay Sports Trust evening held in the Waipu Celtic Barn foyer on Friday 21 May, talks with triathlete Marco Rodrigue. While at college Marco trained with the Bream Bay Swim Club and has recently taken up triathlon.

Campbell Thompson, a psychologist who accompanied New Zealand's team to the Tokyo Olympics was guest speaker at an event organised by the Bream Bay Sports Trust last Friday night 21 May.

Despite Covid 19 being rampant in Waipu and many people unable to attend a respectable crowd of 56 people filled the Celtic Barn foyer to hear what Mr. Thompson had to say. The crowd included managers and coaches of local sports teams who were there to pick up tips from an expert.

Mr. Thompson showed a video clip of the women's eight rowing team returning to the New Zealand base to a haka performed by the gold medal winning men's eight. He asked what qualities this demonstrated and his audience gave a list including: unity, humility, pride, mutual support, enthusiasm and commitment.

Mr. Thompson said it is important to have rituals of celebration like the haka performed by and for at the Tokyo Olympics

He said he was inspired to study high performance sports psychology after watching New Zealand triathletes Hamish Carter and Bevan Docherty take out the gold and silver medals at the 2004 Olympic Games

"I wondered what the conditions were in the New Zealand triathlon camp that could have produced this result."

He advised sports people to take the time to celebrate small gains they make in training.

"You might be aiming to lift 160 pounds. You have been lifting 100 and one day you manage 110. You are moving in the right direction, you are on your way and you need to stop and celebrate this."

He said that it is not Dame Valerie Adams physicality that made her so successful as a shot putter on the world stage but her commitment. She trained harder than any other athlete he knows and had been throwing the shot put for 10 years before she won Olympic

Hunter transferred to Mt. Albert Grammar in year 9 and joined the Waitakere Swimming Club where he trained under coach Paul Kent.


He will head to Hawaii on 21 August and his mum Kelly Sandford will follow a few days later to watch the last of his races.



Protecting Plant Communities with Pest Control in Ruakaka Wildlife Refuge

Bream Bay Coastal Care Trust and Northland Regional Council with support of the Department of Conservation plan to reduce rabbit numbers in the Ruakaka Wildlife Refuge.

Why we are controlling rabbits

To protect conservation values and improve native plant survival rates on rabbit prone land within the Ruakaka Wildlife Refuge

Environmental effects from rabbits include:

- Depletion of plant communities and reduction in indigenous flora diversity in coastal habitats.
- An increase in areas of bare land as well as soil disturbance.
- A reduction in soil organic matter, and deterioration of soil nutrients and structure.

Pindone operation

The following toxin will be used:

 Pesticide use #72 - Pindone 0.25g/kg Cereal pellet (RS5 Rabbit pellets) – Hand laying.

This operation consists of three separate toxin applications over a four week period in June and July, an application every 7 - 10 days. Baits will be hand laid in a 50x50 metre grid through the operational area, placed on of squares of weed matting pegged to the





Why we are using this method

Densities of rabbits throughout the reserve are increasing. Pesticide offers the most cost-effective way to reduce the rabbit population to low levels. The aim of the control operation is to reduce rabbit infestations to achieve a high native plant survival rate.
The Bream Bay Coastal Care Trust is a local community group formed to help protect the native biodiversity and restore the habitat of the Wildlife


