# Council purchases \$2.8million block of land in central Waipu

The Whangarei District Council has purchased a block of land between Argyle Rd. and South Rd in proximity tto the Waipu townncentre from a developer who pulled out of a proposed 31 lot

Councillor Ken Couper explained to the Waipu Residents and Ratepayers Association that the Council would most likely look for a buyer for the consented subdivision to defray the purchase cost but would be retaining 2.8 hectares of land as green space for the Waipu Community.

There is also a proposal to form a road between Argyle St. and South Rd. so that school children, and their parents, could take this route to get to Waipu Primary School in Argyle St. rather than through the centre of Waipu.

However the Council's Development Relationship Manager John Bent said." Council is yet to decide what will be done with the land."

"Retention by Council of all or part of the land as open space is one of the options that will be considered."

The now Council owned block comprises 4.6531

The purchase price was \$2.8 million.



# **EDITORIAL**

# If I had the witchy powers of the goddess Circe

This afternoon if I get the time I will put in a submission to the Whangārei District Council's 30 to 50 year plan, which needs to be in by Monday. I am a bit cynical about all this blue sky planning and it's not my top priority. My number one task is to find the hole in the chicken run where those pesky birds are getting out to scratch up my garden, I need to hang the sheets on the clothesline and then I want to see what Andrew Little has to say about changes to the national health levels of funding on Q and A on TV1 while I have my morning coffee.

It's the first day of spring and I see the lettuce seeds have come up in my seed tray, so time to dream of summer bounty. But achieving this takes effort and, first things first; I need to keep those chickens contained inside their enclosure.

If and when I get around to that submission I will talk about Bream Bay the beach, sand dunes and adjoining conservation land. In 30 years time I hope the dunes will be protected and intact. We need them to save us from the rising tides of climate change. Where they have been debased (such as in that disgraceful sand bowl area north of the Waipu Estuary) I hope they will be restored.

I hope people will come to understand the dynamism and function of sand dunes and all the ignorant, destructive human behaviour that places them under threat will no longer be allowed to happen.

I received a photograph just this morning from Dr. Mere Kepa showing multiple vehicle tracks on the beach and up into the dunes at Ruakākā alongside, or just north of the NIWA research centre. The photo was accompanied by a poem expressing a wish that the public be better informed about nature and biology.

I am reading a wonderful novel about the Creek goddess and sorceress Circe. When marauding sailors arrive on her island home of Aeaea and abuse her hospitality and her person she turns them into swine and drives them into pens, watching human tears run down their piggy faces. If I had such witchy powers I would be tempted. But back to Bream Bay and my dream for its future. I envisage lush coastal forest reinstated on the back dune conservation land, which at present mostly grows weeds.

Another task on my list for today is to pot up some of the little totara seedlings, which have germinated under a big pin oak in our garden from seed dropped by our resident tui. Once these have grown to around half a metre in height they will go to Bream Bay Coastal Care projects and will play their part in achieving my vision. I have a little incantation I say with my grandson as I press their tiny new grown roots into the damp potting mix.

"Grow, grow little tree and one day you will be a mighty totara."

It's miraculous to think how this could happen and potting up little native trees is likely to be a more useful step towards a better world than filling in yet another submission form.

# \$882,000 already spent on paused Ruakākā Village Kāinga Ora re-development

The sum of \$882,000 had already been spent on the proposed 50 new Kainga Ora homes in the Ruakākā Village before the project was paused by a Government decree that all projects not contracted for building by June 2025 be placed under assessment.

The Bream Bay News asked if Kainga Ora had an assessment of how much all the planning and community consultation that had gone into this

project had cost and received a reply under the Official Information Act.

Caroline Butterworth Deputy Chief Executive for Kainga Ora in Auckland and Northland replied , "I can advise that to date, the planning, design and consenting costs for the proposed 50 homes in Ruakaka is approximately \$17,640 per unit, a total spend of \$882,000. These costs were budgeted for and are comparative (per unit) with other similar redevelopment projects of this size and scale.

Planning costs include geotechnical work, site surveying, engineers, architects and planning consultants who provide technical advice on matters such aw traf-

fic, water and wastewater capacity, flood and hazard risk.

\$13,000 was spent on community engagement including a series of community information sessions held in the Bream Bay Trust. An all-day event was held first, followed by a series of shorter drop-in sessions to suit all different schedules. Hundreds of people attended these events including many people seeking housing support and neighbours of the proposed development.

In June 2024 there were 22,923 applicants waiting for Kainga Ora housing

# Registrations of support invited for the Ruakākā to Marsden Cove shared path project

I was recently surprised to see the lack of shared paths in our Bream Bay Area. It will take a lot of hard work by the community and council to change this. Hats off to the Waipu shared path group for the work they have done between Waipu township and Waipu Cove. This is a vital link for the community and will pay dividends for tourism for the region.

The same goes for the work that the Kaipara District council has done in the Mangawhai heads to township with attractive boardwalks etc.

Despite a very good network of shared paths in Whangārei central, there is very little in the feeder communities of Bream Bay. When you look at the a New Zealand cycleways map it is very apparent to see the lack of shared paths in our area.

Nevertheless the project planned to link Marsden Cove to Ruakākā Township is not only a shared path but also a vital safety project for the area.

I was recently biking in the Marsden Bay Drive area and crossing State Highway 15 to go to Ruakākā and the sun was in a position where it was very hard for a cyclist to see the cars coming towards Northport. I nearly was witness to a very serious accident. When they saw each other they had seconds to avoid each other as the speed limit is 100km before is reduces to 70km after Marsden Bay Drive. There have already been fatalities in the same area and in my view, it is only a matter of time before this happens again.

The Bream Bay Shared path group with the assistance of the Whangarei District Council plan to do something about this. Under the direction of an assigned

team leader from WHangarei District Council we are currently in the planning stage of creating a safe shared and path from the Marsden Cove Marina to the Ruakaka township.

Unfortunately, our first route planned became not possible because of future business developments across the planned track. Therefore, we, with the assistance of WDC had to look at an alternative route. With the assistance of the WDC (Phil Halse- Deputy Mayor), various consultants and affected business owners we are now confident that we can move forward to creating a path in the position suggested. This new route has the bonus of being .5 km. shorter.

Once built it will provide an alternative (crossing over the McEwan bridge and give school children, mothers and our large, retired community a safe way between the two large residential areas, keeping them off the very dangerous SH15 to Port Marsden.

What we need now is business and community to get behind this project to register their support either financially or by equipment and work donated. Any assistance you can give would be greatly appreciated and benefit our community and grow businesses in the area.

# Waipu dog owners successfully defend the Tip Rd. to Uretiti off leash rule

Submissions made by local dog owners to the Whangarei District Council's review of its Dog Management bylaw have paid off with a proposal to bring in a restriction that dogs be banned from the beach at Tip Rd between the hours of 9am to 5pm from 20 December to 31January now dropped from the bylaw.

Under reviewed rules, which were adopted by the Whangarei District Council last week, dogs will continue to be allowed off lease on the

beach and foreshore from south of the Uretiti campground to the Tip Rd. beach access.

Other dog exercise areas in Bream Bay are:

- · Marsden Bay where dogs can be taken on a leash on the beach and foreshore eastward to the groyne.
- · At the northern end of Ruakaka Beach dogs are permitted off leash on the beach from the Mair Road access southward to Taotahi Walk.

# Ruakākā Service Centre developers to appeal WDC decision to decline their application

Ruakākā Developments Ltd. is appealing the decision by the Whangarei District Council to turn down its application for resource consent to develop a service centre including refueling, fast-food outlets and retail north east of the Ruakākā Roundabout

Included in the reasons for the appeal are: the decision will not achieve the efficient use and development of natural and physical resources and it fails to recognize that the application avoids remedies of mitigates any actual or potential adverse environmental effects.

One of the grounds the commissioners who heard the application gave for turning it down is that the development would constitute urban development in a rural

Ruakākā Developments Ltd argues that the development in fact needs a rural setting and direct State Highway access.

In answer to a concern that north travelling vehicles make dangerous u turns to enter the service centre Ruakākā Developments Counsel argues, safety measures such as barriers, traffic islands and signage can be implemented "to ensure U-turns are not and issue."



# Opening date for the new Ruakākā Recreation Centre

A grand opening for the new Ruakākā Recreation Centre will be held on Saturday 5 October from 11am to 1pm.

Shane Jones, the Minister for Regional Development, has been invited to cut the ribbon. Mr. Jones was instrumental in securing the initial \$2.5million grant for the project from the Shovel Ready fund in 2020.

Whangārei Mayor Vince Cocurullo, Bream Bay Councillors and representatives from Foundation North, which contributed some major funding to the new



building, will also attend. The Whangārei Council paid \$1 million towards the landscaping and formation of the carpark

There will be music provided by the Recreation Centre's music group, finger food for everyone and an opportunity for people to look through the new building prior to it opening for business on Monday 7 October. Christine Thirling, the Recreation Centre Manager, said the new building will now be called the Ruakākā Recreation Centre and the old building will be re-

named.

The weather has caused a two week hold up with the laying of some asphalt pavement and Christine has her fingers crossed everything will be ready for the big day.

There was also a hitch when some rolls of wire netting left on site for fencing were stolen. However CCTV footage led local Police to the culprit and the fencing material was recovered.



# Ruakākā solar farm waiting on Northland Regional Council consent


Construction on Meridian Energy's new battery energy storage system at Ruakākā is system is due for completion early next year. While it looks like a field filled with 80 shipping containers, the site will actually store 200MWh of electricity – enough to power around 60,000 average households for up to two hours.

Kerry Thomas – Senior Advisor, Stakeholder Communications for Meridian said, "Battery energy storage systems are playing an increasingly important role in electricity supply. As companies like Meridian grow the amount of renewable energy from sources such as water, wind and sun, battery energy storage systems provide somewhere to store energy for use when demand is high.

She said, "Having that much stored energy available will help smooth out fluctuations in energy supply, and ensure a more secure, stable and resilient electricity grid.

Asked if there were any updates on the solar farm Meridian is planning to build alongside the BESS and along the northern side of Marsden Point Rd. as far as the Ruakaka Town Centre. Kerry replied, "Not at this stage. We hope to be able to provide an update sometime in October.

Meridian has resource consents from the Whangārei District Council for the solar farm and related effects including traffic, noise landscape and visual effects and is waiting on a decision from the Northland Regional Council on earthworks stormwater diversion and discharges, and vegetation clearance.





# St Peters Waipu gets a new church organ

If you stand near the front door of St Peters Anglican Church, in Nova Scotia Rd., Waipu you may hear something never experienced in Waipu before, the sound of a church organ.

A small group of women are fundraising to pay for the new instrument. They have made a down payment of approximately a third of the \$28,750 cost and are looking for public donations and grants to make up the rest of this sum.

They invite people to join their FOTO (Friends of the Organ) group at a small annual fee.

Sally Haigh said when a new organ is installed it needs to be "voiced' to the specific accoustics of the building and on a "wonderful morning" last week ???, the organist at St Pauls in Dunedin had come to Waipu to carry out this task.

Sally said St Peters is a lovely building and should be used and enjoyed by people in the community. It can comfortably seat between 50 – 80 people and the FOTO group is planning to hold concerts, the first of these on 20 October – with Anne Connolly-Munt and Stephen Beech, organist at St. Georges Church in Takapuna playing duets and solos on piano and organ. They are also holding regular hymn singing sessions accompanied by Anne on the organ. These are held on the first Sunday of each month from 2pm to 3pm through to November, with a pause over the Christmas

Retired Anglican Priest Richard Hancock will talk about the origin and history of some of the old hymns and after the sessions there will be a shared afternoon tea.

Anne, who has been the organist at St Peters Cathedral in Hamilton and once gave a half hour recital in the Gloucester Cathedral, is willing to teach any interested person to play the new organ. She said prospective organists would need to have at least a Grade 6 pianoo level.

She also hopes young musicians wanting experience at performing in a concert situation will take advantage of the regular concerts planned for the church.

Once the organ is fully paid for it will be gifted to the church.

The organ project team are: Sally Haigh, Christine Anderson and Shelley Couper and they have the support of Bream Bay's Anglican Priest, Reverend Dr. Mark Henrickson and the Parish Council.

Finemoka Fotuhetule, who teaches Pasifika dance in Bream Bay and Whangārei is planning to take some of the members of her Taonga O Te Moana group (formerly known as the Fale Pasifika Dance Academy) to Te Maeva Nui

festival in the Cook Islands in 2025. Te Maeva Nui is the Pasifika equivalent of the Te Matatini the nation wide kapahaka festival here in NZ.

The group is fundraising to help with the fares, which work out at around \$3,000 per person.

Last Friday they held an event at Flip Out in Whangārei with a hangi and bake stall. On Wednesday 23 October there will be a fundraising quiz night at the RAZZA in Wainu

Taonga O Te Moana holds regular after school classes for 5 -16 year olds in Whangārei each Friday, in the Waipu Presbyterian Hall on Wednesdays and at the Bream Bay Community Trust on Mondays.

Finemoka said, she works to connect local kids to Pasifika Culture through dance and music.

"I direct and teach Pasifika Dance and provide opportunities for children aged 5-17 to come and learn cultural dance not only from their own heritage but from other Island Nations as well and we share our Taonga (culture) to the wider community." Fifty children and young people from Wellsford to Whangārei now belong to the group.

Taonga O Te Moana dancers have performed at many local events over the past two years including the Waipu Carnival, and the Got Ya Gummies mental health day in the Waipu Caledonia Park last November and the Bream Bay Matariki Festival held at Waipu Primary School in June 2024.

# A bit of sorting out needed between the Waipu Bowling club and its neighbour the Croquet Club

There is a situation that needs a bit of sorting out between the Waipu Croquet Club and the Waipu Bowling Club. Around a third of the croquet lawns are on land, which legally belongs to the bowling club. The bowling club has sent a letter to the Croquet Club asking it to send representatives to a meeting to discuss what the Croquet Club would consider a reasonable rent and suggesting a plan be put in place for the Croquet Club to purchase the subject land.

George Mutch the Bowling Club secretary said that with rates going up it seems reasonable the Croquet Club make a contribution towards this expense. The croquet club occupies approximately 25% of the land the Bowling Club is paying rates on. In the past the Croquet Club had been sent an invoice once a year, which it had honoured but with a change in committee members at both clubs this practice had ceased.

George said the bowling club has no immediate plans for the land but whose to say what could happen in the future. The land in question would be enough for an additional bowling green. We don't have \$500,000 on hand to build one but theoretically a new member could come along and offer us a big grant. The Croquet Club is a good club with a growing membership so it might be sensible for it to secure its future by purchasing the land. Croquet Club members see things a bit differently. They believe the bowling club and croquet club land was given to the two clubs by the Caledonian Society over 100 years ago . Gordon Walker of the Croquet Club who has been busy fundraising for the new Waipu Menzshed said he thought he could take a bit of a break from fillout funding application forms for a while but thinks he will now need to get back onto the job for the Croquet Club.

# Getting some tips from a pro - young rugby league players are taking advantage of Friday afternoon training sessions with former Warrior and kiwi's player Louis Anderson

There are shream Bayungews by augut 2 players in Bream Bay and when rugby league international Louis Anderson, who now lives in Waipu, offered to give them some technical tips they turn up to listen and learn

Lui was appointed earlier this year as Northland's rugby league development officer, focusing on grassroots development, talent identification, and the implementation of programs designed to empower aspiring athletes and coaches.


